## Start Somewhere Walk

Welcome to our fifth year of participating in the Healthiest State Walk. On Wednesday, October 5, 2016 at 10:00 the DNH Community Schools will be sponsoring **Start Somewhere Walks** at each of the Dike and New Hartford campus. We will join hundreds of thousands of Iowans today. In the last three years more than 650,000 Iowans participated in the “Start Somewhere” initiative. In 2010, Iowa ranked 19<sup>th</sup> as the Healthiest State in the nation. In 2011, we moved to 16<sup>th</sup>. Last year, according to the 2013 Gallup-Healthways Well-Being Index<sup>®</sup>, Iowa was #10 in the nation when it comes to being physically, emotionally, and mentally healthy. Though cracking the top 10 is a great improvement from the #19 position we held when the Initiative was announced, we know we can claim the #1 spot by 2016.

While this ranking puts us solidly in the top quarter of the country and is an improvement over our previous ranking of 16<sup>th</sup>, we can still do better. Governor Branstad’s goal is to move to be the healthiest state in the nation in the next two years. The intent of the Healthiest State Walk is to encourage Iowans to take their own steps that will improve our state’s well-being rank as well as their own health and happiness. This initiative partners the Blue Zone Project which Cedar Falls and Waterloo are two local Iowa communities currently selected to go through this process.

Thank you for being one of the Iowans today making strides toward improving the health of our great state of Iowa!

We will walk 1,000 meters which is 2 ½ times around the track. Enjoy!!

### ACT

- The next scheduled test is December 10<sup>th</sup> and the registration deadline is November 4<sup>th</sup>. Seniors who still need to take the ACT this is the test date to pick. Sooner the better. All juniors who are planning to take the ACT are urged to wait and test on the April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017 test date. The deadline to sign up for this date is March 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017. The rationale for testing in April is that the ACT is based on junior level curriculum and April is the latest test date during the junior school year to take the test.

There is a June test date after the academic year has ended if the student wishes to test after school is no longer in session. The deadline for the June 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017 test date is May 5<sup>th</sup>, 2017. To register for the ACT go online to [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org). 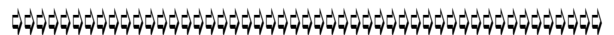

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## Study of Iowa High Schools is coming to our school!

The Study of Iowa High Schools researchers will be working in our school this year (one of 45 schools around the state) to learn about the impact of school improvement efforts on instruction and student outcomes. They will be inviting selected 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade core subject classes soon. Please ask your student if he/she has a packet for you with more information about the study. We are hoping to get a high participation rate! We are once again experiencing a very good start to the school year. There are a lot of different activities going on in classrooms, fall athletic teams are experiencing great success, and students are preparing for the fall production of “Buckshot and Blossoms”, which I am sure will be a great performance.

For the last year or so, we have been conducting training with our staff on how to handle a situation for a dangerous intruder in our buildings or on our campus. For several years we have had emergency procedure plans for a dangerous intruder, but over time, research and situations across the world have shown that our previous procedures may not have been the best to use in every situation. Our previous procedure called for us to lock doors, hide, stay put, and wait for help. Over time, it has become apparent that we need to give our people options in a time of crisis. Therefore, we have researched different procedures, given staff training, discussed these processes with our students, met with law enforcement and fire/rescue officials, and are now conducting evacuation drills with the students. These drills are similar to the drills we already do for fire and tornados.

Our new plans call for us to give our people options so they can, in their best judgement, do what they need to do to get to safety and/or protect themselves and others against possible harm. In some cases, it may be best for individuals to still lock themselves into a room and hide, but then, they need to evaluate their situation and look for other options. Those options may include barricading the door to that room so if the intruder would try to get in, it would be very difficult. Another option may be for people to look for a route of escape and run to a safe place away from the building. If people can't get away from the building and an intruder is closing in on them, their best option may be to plan to fight. This does not mean they will

directly confront the individual, but if they are cornered, they need to do what they can to divert the intruders attention. This could be done by throwing items such as books, staplers, computers or other things at the intruder so they are put in a defensive mode versus an offensive mode. This would definitely look different in one of our elementary buildings as compared to the high school.

We have also set locations within our communities where we want our staff and students to go in case we have to evacuate the buildings. These are common sites, which even our youngest students should know and/or be able to recognize. These locations are also where our fire and rescue personnel are planning to go to assist our students and staff. We would ask that parents/guardians would report to these areas to reunite with their children instead of going directly to the individual buildings. The destinations sites in New Hartford will be the community building, public library, and Methodist Church. In Dike we will evacuate to the bus garage/pool, public library, and the city park next to Peoples Savings Bank.

Law enforcements plans have also changed over time. Their old plan was to get to the building, wait outside for backup to arrive and then enter the building as a team. Their new plan is to enter the building as soon as they arrive on scene and try to confront the intruder. This has shown to bring a quicker end to the event. Law enforcement will then secure the building, locate people that may still be in the building and then evacuate them to the safe locations within the town where they can reunite with family members.

Even though we are conducting these drills, please realize that if something was to happen in one of our buildings, what we actually do may look much different based on the circumstances of the event. It is our hope that we never have to deal with something like this, however, we also know that no place is 100% immune from something like this happening. If you have questions or concerns about any of this

information, please feel free to contact me or one of the building principals.

**Dike-New Hartford Board of Education  
September Board Meeting**

After a walk-through of the Dike facilities, the Dike-New Hartford Board of Education met on September 19, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room for the annual meeting with Koop presiding and members Hinde, Lizer and Lotts. Nielsen was absent. Also present were administrators Hunt, Laube, Lehr, Martinek and Textor.

Visitors present at the meeting included Mary Simons.

The annual meeting agenda was approved on motion of Hinde and second of Lotts. Vote all aye.

Merfeld reviewed with the board 2015-16 annual reports including the Certified Annual Report (CAR), Treasurer's Annual Report, Nutrition Fund Annual Report, Activity Fund Annual Report, Transportation Annual Report, and the Special Education Supplement, which were all approved as presented on motion of Lizer and second of Lotts. Vote all aye.

Lizer was elected president for 2016-17 and Hinde vice president. Merfeld administered the oath of office. Merfeld was re-appointed as secretary for 2016-17 on motion of Lizer and second of Hinde with a salary increase of 3.58%. Vote all aye.

On motion of Lotts, the law firms of Swisher & Cohrt and Ahlers & Cooney were appointed as legal counsel for 2016-17. Second by Hinde. Vote all aye.

Being no further business, the annual meeting adjourned at 7:35 p.m.

The Dike-New Hartford Board of Education met on this date at 7:35 p.m. after the annual meeting for the regular monthly meeting with Lizer presiding and members Hinde, Koop and Lotts. Nielsen was absent. Also present were administrators Hunt, Laube, Lehr, Martinek and Textor.

Visitors present at the meeting included Mary Simons.

The August 15, 2016 minutes were approved as written on motion of Hinde and second of Koop. Vote all aye.

The agenda was approved as amended on motion of Koop and second of Lotts. Vote all aye.

Oral and written reports of the principals and technology coordinator were reviewed with no action taken.

On motion of Koop and second of Lotts, SIAC committee members for 2016-17 were approved. Vote all aye.

Koop, Lotts and Nielsen were appointed to serve on the Butler, Black Hawk and Grundy County Conference Boards respectively on motion of Lotts and second of Koop. Vote all aye.

Hunt reported that preliminary numbers show students served in our buildings at 895 as compared to 888 last year. Certified enrollment numbers will be reviewed in October.

On motion of Koop and second of Hinde, the student teacher agreement with Buena Vista University was approved. Vote all aye.

A 28E agreement with Waverly-Shell Rock for the Bremwood program was approved on motion of Koop and second of Lotts. Vote all aye.

The resignation of Brynn Brass as Assistant Speech Coach was approved on motion of Lotts and second of Hinde. Vote all aye.

Hunt and Lehr discussed updating our bus cameras with a new digital system. More information will be brought to the October meeting. Also more information about updating building security cameras was requested.

Hunt reviewed with the board the updated five year facility plan. Preliminary plans for summer 2017 maintenance projects including Dike athletic complex improvements were discussed. It was the consensus of the board to solicit bids for architect services in regard to this project.

The bills of the General, Activity and Nutrition Funds were approved for payment on motion of Koop and second of Hinde. Vote all aye.

On motion of Koop and second of Lotts, the Financial Reports of the General and Activity Funds were approved. Vote all aye.

On motion of Koop and second of Hinde, President Lizer will be authorized to sign checks and other necessary forms at Peoples Savings Bank. Vote all aye.

The 2016-17 Title I application in the amount of \$72,736 was approved on motion of Lotts and second of Hinde. Vote all aye.

On motion of Lotts and second of Hinde, the 2015-16 Modified Allowable Growth Request for Special Ed deficit in the amount of \$59,410.52 was approved. Vote all aye.

The Board discussed the recent walk-through tours of both Dike and New Hartford facilities. Hinde will submit a list of items that need to be addressed.

IASB Convention plans were discussed.

Being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:55 p.m.

# Dike-New Hartford Community School Public Notification

**EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY & AFFIRMATIVE ACTION** - The Dike-New Hartford Community School District shall provide equal opportunity to all employees and applicants for employment in accordance with all applicable Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action laws, directives and regulations of federal, state and local governing bodies and agencies. **EQUITY GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE** – Dike-New Hartford students and parents/guardians are hereby notified that in accordance with federal regulations assuring all students of equal opportunities and treatment in the total education program, grievance procedures have been adopted by the Dike-New Hartford Board of Education. The first step of this procedure is an informal review whereby a student who believes she/he has been discriminated against because of race, color, national origin, gender, disability, religion, creed, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity or socioeconomic status should discuss the problem with the teacher or principal. If a formal grievance (Level 2) is requested, it should be initiated within fifteen (15) working days of the alleged discrimination with the Compliance Officer. The Compliance Officer (Equity Coordinator) for the facilities at Dike is Irvin Laube, high school principal (319-989-2485 or [irvin.laube@dnhcsd.org](mailto:irvin.laube@dnhcsd.org)); and the Compliance Officer for the facilities at New Hartford is Jerold Martinek, PreK-8 principal (319-983-2206 or [jerold.martinek@dnhcsd.org](mailto:jerold.martinek@dnhcsd.org)). Please feel free to call or visit anytime you wish to have more information, discuss a problem or to begin investigation procedures. In the event that a problem is not satisfactorily resolved at level two, then it may proceed to level three with the superintendent.

This procedure in no way denies the right of the grievant to file formal complaints with the Iowa Civil Rights Commission, the Federal Office of Civil Rights or other agencies available for mediation or rectification of civil

rights grievances or to seek private counsel for complaints alleging discrimination.

**GUN CONTROL LAW** - A recent controversial restriction on gun ownership surrounds possession of guns in schools. The controversy arose when the Supreme Court struck down, in 1995, the Federal Gun-Free School Zone Act as an unlawful federal interference with states' abilities to govern themselves. Forty-nine states have legislation directly or indirectly affecting possession of guns in and around schools. Some of the states have enacted their legislation since the federal act was overturned; some have had such laws on their books for some time. **In any case all states now specifically ban possession of firearms on school grounds.**

## SPECTATOR LETTER

Dike-New Hartford Parents, Fans and Community Members:

Dike-New Hartford has a great tradition of fan and community support for all activities and sporting events. We hope to continue this in the future as the school district has become accustomed to having successful programs, and we truly appreciate the support from our parents, fans, and community members. However, the teachers, coaches, and administrators have some concern over the safety of our students and spectators at some of our recent events.

We have seen an increase in the number of children/students that are coming to our events, either by themselves unsupervised or with their parents and allowed to play ball or simply run around the school facilities during an event. In the football field area, we have had several issues with children, running, sitting on top of or climbing on the fences, throwing and kicking balls and/or bottles, and playing under the bleachers. Inside the building, we have had children/students running around in the hallways and concession areas where there is glass and other objects that could cause serious injuries. This type of behavior also creates a concern for other fans as they are trying to move from one area to another and enjoy whatever activity they are attending.

The school district does provide supervisors at events, but they simply cannot be in every location to handle every situation that may occur. So, we are asking that all children/students come to school games/activities accompanied by a responsible adult that will make sure the children/students are there to enjoy the activity. We ask that parents do not allow their students/children to bring balls and/or other things that can be thrown around during the game. If children/students would rather play ball or run around with their friends instead of sit or stand and enjoy the game/activity, we ask that they not come to the game/activity. If a child/student is at a game/activity and they are creating issues that are unsafe for themselves or others, they will be asked to either return to the bleachers or sit or stand with the adult that is responsible for them. If the child/student refuses to comply with the reasonable request or returns to their unsafe activity they will be asked to leave the school grounds.

We truly appreciate everyone's support and hope that we can continue the great traditions we have become accustomed to here at DNH. It is our wish that everyone can come to all activities, be loud, proud, and positive supporters of the Wolverines in a safe, comfortable environment. We thank you for your cooperation!!!
